3. Mental Health Partnership Agreement

VP GSBS reminded the committee that this was discussed at the last meeting (11/03/2018) and that the action point remained unchanged. VP GSBS will be meeting with delegates from NUS later today to formalise the Mental Health Partnership Agreement and, when this has been achieved, the document can then be published to the wider student body.

4. GCU Equality and Diversity Update

VP GSBS has had a meeting regarding the preventing gender-based violence initiative and has also met with the new named contact for this project at GCU. Currently, discussions are taking place about how next academic year's process will operate (such as training processes). VP GSBS is also having meeting regarding the First Responder process.

5. Officer/Champion Update

- Full Time Officers

VP GSBS has received information that sanitary products will be made available from August to all staff and students at GCU (both Glasgow and London campuses). This will operate on a year-long pilot.

- Women's Officer

The Women's Officer shared with the committee that she has been trying to increase student engagement within the liberation group as this has been an ongoing challenge throughout this academic year. However, delegates from the Women's group are being sent to the NUS Women's conference taking place on 17/04/2018.

- Societies Champion

The Societies Champion stated that the Equality & Diversity policy has been adhered to for all activities and events organised by societies. The African Caribbean Society have been nominated for "Best New Society" and are delivering a Fashion Show in May alongside receiving funding from the GCU Students' Association Dragon's Den panel.

CUMSA (Caledonian University Muslim Students' Association) organised a dinner which was funded by Societies council.

6. Upcoming Campaigns

- Gender-based Violence

VP GSBS mentioned that GCU will be launching the Gender-based Violence Policy in May 2018 and this will be a major event so if any committee member wishes to be invited to attend the launch event, they are welcome to let her know by the end of the week.

7. AOCB

- Committee By-Law Update

It was noted that in previous committee meetings, there was an action to update the E&D bylaws. VP GSBS has done this and, as it was approved by the committee, it will be presented at the next Student Voice meeting (due October 2018).

- Representative of the Year

It was noted that Fraser Knight (LGBT+ Officer) has been shortlisted for the "Representative of the Year" award as part of the GCU Students' Association's STAR Awards. The winner will be announced on 19/04/2018.
