

CAREER LAUNCH

Whether you know exactly what you want to do after university or you are keeping your options open, being a Full Time Officer will help you achieve your career goals.

The skills you gain as an Full Time Officer are invaluable and not typical to your average graduate job. Being an Full Time Officer gives you the skill set for the administrative side that all these organisation have. You might not need these skills until mid-career but once you are there, you will have an advantage over those who went straight into the frontline.

Maybe you're unsure what you want to do after graduation. Did you know university and colleges are a major employer and not just of academics? In 2022 there were over 137,500 "professional service" jobs within UK universities, and being an Full Time Officer will set you up to thrive in this large sector.

ELECTIONS ARE SCARY

Standing in an election can be a daunting prospect but with the right support and preparation, it can also be a rewarding experience; win or lose.

Like any job, there is a selection method for choosing the right person for the role. As this is a leadership position representing GCU students, it is up to GCU students to decide who is best to represent them. Whilst standing in an election can be daunting (like any job interview!), it can also be a rewarding process in itself filled with opportunities to grow.

"IT'S JUST A POPULARITY CONTEST"

At GCU we use an election method that is designed to be less about one person winning it all and more about getting a team of the right people into the role. There is one election with the top four candidates becoming Full Time Officers and voters can preference their vote. Together, this results in the GCU elections being less about pre-election popularity and offers a more level playing field.

I CAN'T STAND BECAUSE OF MY COURSE

Full Time Officers have come from a wide range of courses at GCU including courses that have professional registration requirements. You don't have to be at the end of your course to stand and for those who will be joining professional registrations post-graduation, doing a "sandwich" year as a Full Time Officer during your course may be the way to go.
