Brief Summary of Issues/Topic	Some members of voice are aware that Glasgow Caledonian University has three primary campuses, Glasgow, London and New York alongside connections across the world.
	Most of these connections appear to be quite fruitful and beneficial to the university and its global reputation, however there is uncertainty around the New York campus. To which end, We would like to ask that the Student officers engage with the principal and the Senate to remove the New York campus.
	We are seeking this on the grounds that the university appears to be nothing more than a financial Black hole, that in turn hasn't produced many students since its inception, less than 100 graduates as of 2022

We would ask the student officers to lobby our principal, Senate and other appropriate members of the university for the removal of the New York campus and to reallocate the funds towards lecturers' pay scales and invest in the student culture here in the UK as opposed to further financing a campus that causes a deficit each year.
